The Company

Dublin Port Company is a self-financing, private limited company, wholly owned by the State and reporting to the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport. It is the largest port on the island of Ireland and, in 2017, had a record cargo throughput of 36.4m gross tonnes. In addition, Dublin Port is a major passenger hub with two million passengers passing through each year on both ferries and cruise ships. By international standards, Dublin is a very busy port with over 16,000 ship movements annually.

Dublin Port Company has responsibility for a harbour area extending over Dublin Bay and additional responsibility for a still wider pilotage district including Dun Laoghaire Harbour.

The Company provides port infrastructure operated by private sector companies operating in competitive markets. The Port has a ten kilometre entrance channel, more than seven kilometres of berths (quay walls and jetties), a fleet of port craft (including pilot boats and tugs), eight ramps for Ro-Ro operations and a land area of 260 hectares.

The Port is situated at the heart of Dublin Bay and is immediately adjacent to sites of national and international environmental importance. It is also bounded by residential and commercial areas.

The Position

Dublin Port Company's Marine Function operates a Marine Operative Pool that is a multi-skilled and multi-functional team. The Marine Operatives, under the supervision of a Team-leader, operate with full flexibility and carry out marine related tasks. Marine Operatives will be expected to carry out duties in all sections of the Marine Function for which they are qualified and /or trained. Appropriate training will be provided to facilitate staff to achieve qualifications as required. The panel will be active for a period of two years maximum.

The Person

Required to hold a valid certificate of competency as Officer of the Watch (OOW) issued in accordance with the requirements of STCW 78/95 (including 2010 Manila amended), be capable of demonstrating small boat handling skills and hold a valid driving licence.

Demonstrate a proven track record, with excellent work ethics, be enthusiastic and possess exceptional interpersonal and communication skills and have the ability to prepare clear and concise reports.
