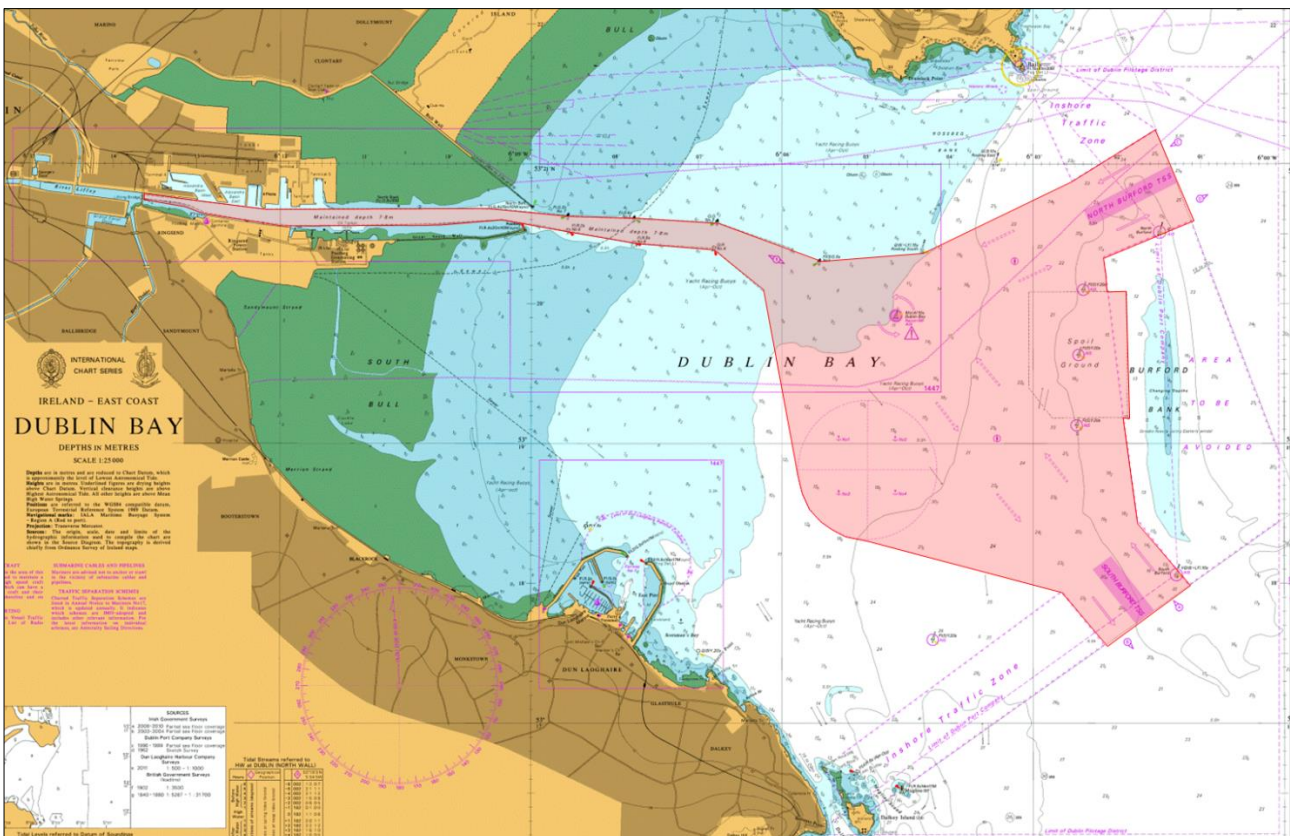


## Fishing Gear

Masters, owners, operators and agents of all vessels and fishing vessel owners, skippers, fishers, and those engaged in fishing within the limits of Dublin Port are advised that;

Fishing gear, pots, nets, lines etc. are not to be laid in such a position where it is likely to become an obstruction or danger to any vessel.

Specifically the laying of fishing gear in the approaches, traffic separation schemes, spoil ground, anchorage, fairway and river as indicated on the attached chart extract is to be avoided. Fishers should be aware that vessels and craft approach the above named areas from various directions.

When laid, all fishing gear should be clearly visible, marked with an appropriate buoy; if possible they should be lit to aid visibility. Fishing gear found to be a danger to navigation may be moved or removed without notice.
